About The University



Doctor Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya, formerly known as the University of Saugor, was established on 18th July 1946 by Dr. Sir Hari Singh Gour through his personal savings of about two crore rupees. It holds the distinction of being the 18th University of India and the oldest and largest University of Madhya Pradesh. Dr. Gour, a renowned jurist, educationist, philanthropist, and social reformer, also served as the first Vice-Chancellor of the University of Delhi (1922–1926) and twice as Vice-Chancellor of Nagpur University. In recognition of his contributions, the University was renamed Doctor Harisingh Gour Vishwavidyalaya in 1983. Located 5 km east of Sagar city, its 1312-acre campus on the Pathariya hills is considered one of the most picturesque and biodiversity-rich campuses in India.

The Department of Psychology was established as an independent entity on 18 March 1963, with Dr. Jai Prakash serving as its first Head. Over the years, eminent scholars such as Prof. H. S. Asthana, Prof. I. S. Muhar, Prof. A. K. Purohit (Fulbright Fellow, Harvard), Prof. Y. S. Vagarecha, Prof. V. K. Kool, Prof. Udai Jain, Dr. B. B. Asthana, and Prof. V. Shriwastava (1981–2014) made significant contributions to its development in both teaching and research. The department has a rich academic legacy and continues to uphold its tradition of excellence by nurturing innovation, critical thinking, and interdisciplinary engagement in the field of psychology.

About The NAOP









How To Reach Sagar



Sagar is situated at Saugor (WCR) railway station & directly connected to major cities like Mumbai, Delhi, Jaipur, Baroda, Kolkata, Allahabad, Varanasi etc. It is also well connected through Bina Junction (78Km) and Katni Junction (190Km) to almost all parts of the country. Connecting trains are easily available from Bina and Katni.


Tourist Spots Near Sagar



Orchha, a historic town in Madhya Pradesh, is renowned for its forts, temples, and palaces built by the Bundela rulers. The Orchha Fort complex, Ram Raja Temple, and riverside chhatris are its main attractions. Known for Mughal-Bundela architecture and spiritual charm, it is a popular tourist spot. Orchha is about 200 km from Sagar.

The Khajuraho Group of Monuments are a group of Hindu and Digambara Jain temples in Chhatarpur district, Madhya Pradesh, India. It is a UNESCO World Heritage Site since 1986, Khajuraho attracts tourists and scholars alike for its historical significance, artistic mastery, and cultural importance. The temples symbolize the rich heritage of Indian art and the blend of spirituality and sensuality in Hindu tradition. They are about 202 km from Sagar





Sanchi, in Madhya Pradesh, is world-famous for its ancient Buddhist monuments. Located about 120 km from Sagar, it is home to the Great Stupa, built by Emperor Ashoka in the 3rd century BCE, one of India's oldest stone structures. The site features beautifully carved gateways (toranas) illustrating the life of Buddha and Jataka tales. Recognized as a UNESCO World Heritage Site, Sanchi stands as a symbol of peace, spirituality, and India's cultural heritage, attracting visitors and pilgrims from across the globe.

Bhimkund, located near Chhatarpur in Madhya Pradesh, is a natural water tank surrounded by myth and mystery. It is believed that Bhim, one of the Pandavas, struck the ground with his mace during exile, and this eternal water source emerged, hence the name Bhimkund. The tank is considered sacred, with crystal-clear blue water that never dries up, even in droughts. Scientists remain intrigued by its unknown depth. Devotees visit for its religious significance, while tourists admire its natural beauty and legends. Bhimkund is around 180 km from Sagar.
